

**Apremont Envers**                      shady                      p33  
A quiet area. Most boulders are low and have good landings.

Park as for Bas Cuvier. Take the Route de la Solitude on the opposite side of the N7, to Bas Cuvier (see map on p190). The boulders can be found to the left and right in the forest, after 650 metres, just past the Carrefour de Félix Herbet. The most easterly boulders are found by going left on the Route de Barbizon à Fontainebleau, at the Carrefour de Félix Herbet. Turn right after 250 metres onto the Route du Désert to where the orange circuit crosses the path. The most westerly boulders are found by following the red circuit to the west from 36 red.

**Apremont Bizons**                      shady                      p35  
Quiet area. Nearly all boulders are low and have good landings.

Follow the Rue Grande in Barbizon past the post office. This road leads into the forest and beyond the village is called the Allée aux Vaches. Take a right on the T-junction at the café. At the first bend in the road, drive straight on, onto the Route du Marie Thérèse. Park here and then go right, past the GR1, into the forest to get to the boulders. For the most easterly part of the area, take the Route du Marie Thérèse from the car park for 100 metres to a clearing on the left which leads to the boulders.

**Apremont (buvette)**                      p35  
Noisy area with one seventh grade boulder and a traverse (no topo).

Park at the café (see Apremont Bizons). Follow the SB6, behind the café. There is a 'floating' boulder (the boulder doesn't touch the ground) to the left, past the first corridor. A few turns further, to the right of the path, on top of the hill is another 'floating' boulder. The described problem is situated on this boulder, on the side of the path.

**Apremont (ouest)**                      open                      p37  
An area with mainly low boulders but a few high exceptions. Not all boulders have good landings.

As for Apremont Bizons. Park one car park further down the road, on the left. The first boulders are close to the car park lot along the GR1.

**Apremont**                      open                      p39  
Area with both high and low boulders. Not all problems have good landings.

As for Apremont (ouest). Take one car park further down the road (also on the left). The first boulders are visible from the car park; for the first seventh grade problem, take the path that is perpendicular to the road, for 150 metres.

**Apremont (est)**                      quick drying                      p41  
A large and popular area with both high and low boulders. Most problems have good landings.

Park as for Apremont. Take the Route de Gorges d'Apremont on the right. The red circuit starts after 150 metres, on the right hand side of the path. The other boulders are on the left, on the hill.

**Vallon de la Solitude**                      p43  
Very quiet area mainly with low boulders, often sporting poor landings.

Park as for Apremont. Take the Route des Gorges d'Apremont on the right. Turn left on the crossroads after 300 metres, onto the Route de la Solitude. The boulders are situated left and right of the path after another 200 metres.

**Apremont Désert**                      quick drying                      p43  
Very quiet area with a few high boulders and generally good landings.

Park as for Apremont. Take the Route des Gorges d'Apremont on the right. At the crossroads after 700 metres, turn left onto the TMF/SB6-6 (this is the second crossroads from the car park). After another 300 metres, on the crossroads with the SB6, take a right up the hill. The boulders are 75 metres past the top, on the south side of the ridge.
